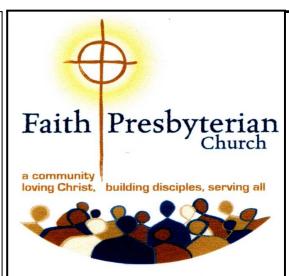

## **Acoustic Improvements Funding Update**

Session approved a three-phased plan for improving acoustics (sound and music) in the sanctuary and narthex, installation of a modern audio-visual system, and replacement of the current organ. A fundraising campaign was initiated in June and will continue until the end of August. After the receiving gifts and pledges on Sunday, July 20<sup>th</sup>, we now have 56 gifts and pledges for a total of \$33,170 to add to the building fund. With paid pledges the total in the building fund, which will be used to fund Phase I, is approximately \$78,000. This is about 76 % of what is needed to complete Phase I. We also know that \$6,170 is pledged to be paid monthly through December 31<sup>st</sup>. This brings the percentage to 84%. We are very close to raising sufficient funds for completing Phase I!

If you have made a cash gift or a pledge, we gratefully thank you for your generosity. If you have not made a cash gift or pledge, please consider giving one before the end of August. We are close to fully funding Phase I and after improvements for Phase I are completed
