

What Are Those Elders Up to Now?

Highlights from Our November Session Meeting



The following are some of the decisions which were made this month at Session (elder board) and some of the areas of ministry which were celebrated. We hope you share in the enthusiasm of Session in all that God is doing in our midst. As a reminder, Session meetings are held the 2nd Monday of each month at 7:00 here at church. Unless otherwise determined, they are open meetings and church members are always encouraged to come listen in. We'll even share our snacks!

A Reminder of our Trust – In addition to the guidance from scripture and from our Book of Order, Session also has a list of “Unwritten Rules” to which we adhere. This past month we took a moment to remind ourselves of Rule #5 on that list which states: “*We trust one another.* Since FPC is a growing congregation with many areas of ministry, we must be divided into committees to do our work. It is impossible for any one person to know all the things that can happen in ministry in and around FPC. Therefore, it is imperative that we place trust in one another’s leadership and oversight. Written committee reports should be thorough so that information is available on significant ministry decisions. Whenever necessary, elders should seek out more information in a spirit of trust and respect.”

Session Seeks Discernment on Possible Staffing Changes – Though no final decisions have been made, our Session is now carefully considering a possible rearrangement and/or enhancement of our property maintenance staff. Our Property Maintenance team, under the lead of elder Dave Williamson, has been working tirelessly on this issue for many months now. We anticipate a decision in the next month or two. Session, at the request of our Lay Ministry team, is also looking closely at expanding our leadership when it comes to the area of communication. One option along these lines would be the creation of a new staff position.

Vision Team Set to Travel to Ethiopia in March – Session enthusiastically voted to send Maria Rodriguez, Walt McDaniel, and Pastor Jeff Chapman to represent Faith on a World Vision sponsored vision trip to Ethiopia March 4-13, 2010. This trip will be another key step in our participation in Sacramento Hope, an initiative which was formally introduced to the congregation on Sunday, November 8th. This Season's Hard Lessons in Love and Hope Pastor Jeff Chapman

In some ways this has been a very difficult season in the life of our church. In particular, our Faith community has gathered seven different times for memorial services in the last month or so. By any standards, that is a lot of loss.

Some among us who long-loved these dear people have been, of course, profoundly affected. But even if you are somebody who did not know any of the individuals who are now gone from our midst, even you are going to be affected because *your community* is affected.

There are a lot of things I can say about all this. I'll limit myself to just two.

First, I have visibly reminded of the depth of *love* which exists in this congregation.

I know that when people die, it's not uncommon for people around them to extend their sympathies and to offer support. I know that. But in this place it goes much deeper than that. Because when our own families these past weeks have sustained heart-breaking losses and the our community has gathered around them, *Christ himself has gathered*.

When I say that, I say that literally. You, the people of God, have become the hands, and the hearts, and the ears, and the voice of Christ in this time for these hurting people. Through the community, the church, God shares the pain, and the grief, and the ache of those who are hurting. Through the community, the church, God extends the grace, and the comfort, and the hope of Christ. It reminds me of what Paul writes when he teaches us in I Corinthians 12 that the church is the body of Christ. In verse 26 of that chapter he writes, "If one part [of the body] suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it." I have seen that with my own two eyes right here at Faith.

Second, I have also been so powerfully reminded of the depth of *hope* which exists in this congregation.

As we have gathered together at these memorial services, there certainly has been quite a bit of pain and grief. But there has been, thankfully, more hope. As we have recited to one another the promises which God has made to us in Christ, we assure one another that there is nothing that we cannot face in this life, even death, without hope. As Romans 8:37 reminds us, "In all these things we are more than conquerors through Christ who loved us!"

I need to live in a community like this one. For the world will be hard to me and my family just like it will, and has, been hard to you and your family. And I desperately need people around me when I get knocked down to remind me that there is always hope. I need people to tell me again and again that one day our God who loves us forever will put everything forever right again. For if I don't have others around me reminding me of that, there is a pretty good chance I will forget.

So even though this season has been hard on many of us, I am grateful for the lessons it has taught us. Mostly, I am as grateful as I ever have been to find myself a part of this community of love and hope.

I look forward to worshipping our gracious God with you this Sunday. I really do.



Why Ethiopia? A Personal Journey.

Earlier this year when Session discussion led to the creation of the Mission Task Force, we talked about the importance of complementing our local mission commitment with a global emphasis. I was excited about our desire to deepen our commitment to mission locally. I was equally excited to think about expanding our mission activities to areas beyond our borders. Having served on a mission team that built homes in Mexico many years ago, I could quickly see how Faith could engage in exciting mission work beyond our own borders. However, when I first heard someone throw out the idea that we should consider areas as far away as Africa, I was a bit stunned.

My initial reaction was why should we consider such distant places for mission when there are so many in need closer to home? After all, I had seen, first hand the depth of need that lies within just a few miles of our boarder with Mexico. What I can tell you now is I am glad that I kept my heart and mind open to where God was leading us.

As I look back on my personal journey this past year, I see that God was at work in me though the sermon series on the Letter from James. Perhaps you recall these words from James 2:14 -

14What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

Looking back, I can see that God through the preaching of His Word was tilling the soil for what was to come. Shortly after the Mission Task Force had been commissioned, Pastor Jeff mentioned that he had read a very compelling book and suggested that it might be something I would enjoy. The book is titled "The Hole in Our Gospel" authored by Richard Sterns, CEO of World Vision.

As I read this amazing book, several important thoughts jumped out at me. First, through the experiences of Richard Sterns, I was reminded of how profound the needs are in Africa. Of greater importance, I was finally able to see solutions. Solutions that we as individuals and we as a community of faith can actually get our arms around that will save countless lives and transform entire communities for generations to come.

For me, God's message through Richard Sterns was fresh seed planted on fertile ground. God's message to not only have faith, but to have works was now taking root.

So why Ethiopia?

Let me start with a quote from Albert Einstein, "Coincidence is God's way of remaining anonymous." Consider the following:

1. The Presbyterian Church's commitment to mission in Ethiopia dating back to the 1950's.
2. The local Ethiopian Orthodox Church group who sought out Faith as a place to worship.
3. For the past several years, five to six churches in our Presbytery have been at work in Ethiopia.
4. Last year, God led Pastor Jeff and Esther to adopt two beautiful children from Ethiopia.
5. This year a new partnership is being formed between World Vision and more than 20 Sacramento area churches, all focused on making a difference in one country: Ethiopia!

So, when our Mission Task Force returned with their recommendation that Faith join the Sacramento Initiative to "Bring Hope to Ethiopia", it was just another in what some may consider to be a series of coincidences. However, I do not see these as coincidences, I believe that God is at work, and in His amazing way is waving signs in our collective faces, telling us that we have work to do, serving our sisters and brothers in Ethiopia.

Consider the following. In Ethiopia, only 22% of the population has access to clean water. Now, consider the fact that more than 380,000 children died in 2007 before reaching their 5th birthday. Consider the fact that when a clean water well is introduced in an area, the infant mortality rate is immediately cut in half. Finally, consider the fact that a clean water well costs less than \$20,000. Just imagine, by working together to raise just \$20,000 we can save the lives of thousands of children year after year after year.

Once I had connected these dots, I became personally convinced that God's call could not be any clearer and the words from James began to ring in my ears -

14What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that?

An Update from the Finance Committee

September 30th marked the end of the third quarter of our financial year. Things continue to look good from our perspective. You may recall that our 2009 budget included a \$23,000 deficit.

As of September 30th Faith's income (\$504,269) exceeds expense (\$488,375).

On the income side, areas of giving continue to meet or exceed our budget plans. Thank you to all who give to the mission of Faith Presbyterian Church (FPC), pledged and unpledged.

On the expense side, we are about \$22,712 below our projected expenses. We conservatively estimate that we will end the year with a \$10,000 deficit or better.

On October 25th we held two 2010 budget forums after each service. They were well attended and we thank you for your presence, questions, and insights. If you were not able to attend and would like information or if you have questions about session's proposed budget, please give Finance Elder, Maria Rodriguez a call at 421.6967 or email mmrodrig@aol.com. You are also invited to go to the elder who can speak specifically to your question.

Session members spent much time preparing this budget; first in their committees and then as a session group. This process began in June and culminated in our budget forums. Through prayer, listening, and discussion we present a 2010 budget that is focused on the vision of our church, "A Community Serving Christ, Building Disciples, and Serving All."

A Reflection on Treasure

The following is a recent blog entry from our Stewardship “Treasure Principle” blog. It was written by Faith member, Maria Rodriguez, and is reprinted here with her permission.

Having just finished chapter 6, I was struck that the words of this book apply to the church (Faith Presbyterian Church) just as they apply to me personally. In chapter 6 Mr. Alcorn encourages us to share our stories of giving, just as we share our stories of serving. I have to admit, it makes me a little uncomfortable because I do think about Matthew 6:1, "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven."

And hearing the story this Sunday of the older woman who gave up her piano lessons made me feel sad for her. As do the stories from the book of people giving up money saved for Disneyland trips and Christmas presents and basketball teams...giving up this money for a mission trip. But here is a story from my life this week that I just shared with a long-distance friend:

Cole (my 7 year old son) was collecting change for UNICEF on Halloween. On Sunday night John (my husband) and I were putting our contributions into his box. I found 50 cents. John went looking for \$10. Cole went into his room and was about to put \$20 of his own money in the box. "STOP"....I screamed in my mind. Are ya crazy kid? You can't put that much money in that box.

"Cole," I said instead, "Why don't you consider putting in less?"

John is Looooookiiiiinnng at me. See, at church we have been reading and praying and listening and thinking about giving. The book we are reading argues that all we have belongs to God. We are just stewards of these resources. I am the Finance Elder. John is on the Stewardship Committee. We both have been thinking a lot about what we give to God. And here is my child calling all of my thinking into question.

I am OK with giving MY money away....but my child needs to be protected. Doesn't Cole know that he could use that money to buy more toys? (Disregard the fact that our house has so many toys there is no more storage space left...and most of those toys never are played with). So I bite my tongue. What I want to say is, "Cole, that is too much. Put that \$20 back in your bank and get a dollar."

What I say (because John is still Looooookkkkkkiiiiinggg at me) is, "So Cole, why do you want to put that much money in there?"
